Q: Protagonists At The Edge (27 - 30 May) - In their second graduation production this year, our final-year students got to work with veteran director Ang Gey Pin in an intimate performance at the Esplanade Rehearsal Studio.



ITI Theatre Forum 2015 (27 Jun) -Held at Emily Hill, the ITI Theatre Forum included emerging arts workers such as Ebi Shankara to veteran actors including Li Xie, whose presentations opened up insights into the generation gaps among Singapore's theatre practitioners.



Bert's Devised Theatre workshops (11-12 Apr & 2 May) - Over 30 participants - from the public and students from Victoria Junior College - learnt from faculty member Bert Van Dijk's Devised Theatre workshops. Working with image, location and character, they picked up essentials on this important genre of contemporary theatre.

At The Arts House's World Lit session (2 Apr) and Esplanade The Studios: fifty season (2 May) - ITI Director T. Sasitharan was engaged in April and May to moderate forums in literature and performing arts. At the World Lit session, Sasi led a session with author Githa Hariharan, while at The Studios: fifty session, speakers Aidli 'Alin' Mosbit, Alfian Sa'at, Lok Meng Chue and Claire Wong spoke to Sasi on the Singaporean identity on stage.



ITI as one of Idieri 2015 research hubs (2 Jul) - Dr Charlene Rajendran from the National Institute of Education (NIE) led over 20 delegates to ITI for an afternoon of class observation and interaction with students and faculty. This was a highlight for the international delegates of Idieri - a triennial drama education conference. ITI was selected as a research hub to showcase teaching in a multicultural setting.

• ITI visit of Mechele Leon from University of Kansas (22 Jun) - Chair of the theatre department at the University of Kansas in US, Dr Mechele Leon, dropped in for a visit to discuss possible exchanges for the future.

At the Anglo-Chinese School (Independent) symposium (28 May), Sasi spoke on "Language and The Media - Issues Facing SG in the 21st Century" to the school's IB students; while at the Raffles Girls School "In-Convo Forum: Governance of the arts" (22 Jul), Sasi addressed the growth of the arts in Singapore.

• At the SDEA Theatre Arts Conference (27 Jun) - ITI General Manager, Goh Su Lin, moderated a panel made up of arts leaders Chew Kheng Chuan, Chong Tze Chien and Audrey Wong at The Arts House on "Where are the next generation of arts managers", as one of the dialogue sessions in the four-day SDEA Theatre Arts Conference 2015.
